If you are looking for a quiet getaway with scenic vistas and rustic lodging on a quiet, peaceful lake, the Cliffview Resort is the perfect retreat for you.

If you are looking for excitement with ziplining, hiking, rock climbing, canoeing and horseback riding, the Cliffview Resort has that, too.

“It has been the area’s best-kept secret for so long, but we want to change that,” says Amy Sellin, marketing director at the resort. “We want people to know we are here.”

Cliffview Resort is a blend of both serenity and adventure, with amenities and activities to satisfy someone wanting to take it easy or someone looking for outdoor thrills.

Sitting adjacent to the Red River Gorge, Daniel Boone National Forest and Natural Bridge State Park, the resort has convenient access to a multitude of outdoor activities. Guests can explore more than 600 miles of hiking trails in the national forest, or they can launch a canoe or kayak down the Red River. And there are fishing opportunities just a few yards from the Cliffview Resort lodge.

“I’ve seen them pull out some big ones,” says Wendy Blasdell, lodge manager. “They fish out there, and they swim out there.

They just have a great time.”

The lodge and conference center at Cliffview Resort is one of the largest log structures in Wolfe County and is a perfect location for weddings, family reunions, office retreats, corporate meetings or just about any imaginable group function. It sits along a rocky cliff with a spectacular view of Cowan Fork Gorge and sleeps up to 64 people.

Each room in the lodge is equipped with two queen-size beds and a private bath with unique hand-painted sinks. Two rooms are suites—one with a whirlpool tub and the other with a gas log fireplace. Both rooms have an available connecting door. Most rooms have sliding glass doors leading to an 8-foot wraparound porch. Each room is equipped with flat screen televisions and video service from Mountain Telephone.

“This is the perfect place to just come chill out,” Blasdell says.

Cabins are available for smaller groups with nightly rates starting at \$150 for a two-bedroom unit. Three- and four-bedroom cabins are available and sleep up to 12 people.

Despite the rustic setting, all cabins have fully-equipped kitchens complete with a coffee maker, coffee, microwave, refrigerator, stove, silverware, dishes, pots and pans, toaster, can opener and paper towels. The living rooms are equipped with TVs and Mountain’s telephone service. ☎
