As the song says, It's Summertime and the livin' is easy. Maybe part of the reason why Summertime livin' is easy is that a lot of the food preperation is easy-er.

Like grilling hot dogs and hamburgers.

The summer meals are more casual, more picniclike. Using paper plates and fewer pots and pans. Prep time for many summer meals is minimal and cleanup is a snap.

The very lean beef doesn't hold together on a grill very well unless fortified. The eggs and crackers will keep the burgers from crumbling through the grate. Okay, lets get grillin'!

Very Lean and Yummy Burgers

2 lbs ground sirloin (85 - 90% lean)4-5 tbsp Worcestershire sauce 2 eggs, beaten

20 – 30 Ritz crackers, crushed

Crumble the meat in a mixing bowl. Mix in the Worcester sauce.

Let stand in refrigerator for 20 - 30 minutes. Mix in the beaten eggs and the cracker crumbs. Pat into 8 burger size patties (approx 4 0z. each). Grill over medium heat or fry with a little oil to your desired doneness. Medium to medium-well is recommended.

Serve with your favorite burger fixings. Enjoy.

Red (River Gorge) Dog

Split all-beef wieners lengthwise. Rub the insides with a mixture of ground sage, paprika and cumin. Throw 'em on a hot grill until the skin is starting

to crackle and turn a deep, burnt brown. Toast some buns. (We recommend the same number buns as wieners!)

Spread brown mustard on one side of a bun, then lay on a thinly sliced dill pickle. Those lengthwise sandwich slices are best.

Mix some Heinz 57 or your favorite BBQ sauce with a few drops of Buck Thorn's Deep in Dixie *Fire Water* then coat the other side of the bun with this mixture, letting your taste or adventurous spirit determine the amount of sauce.

If you wish, cold Cole slaw can also be layered on, but that's it. No other toppings allowed. Never, ever put onions on this hot dog. The taste of the onion and sauce will combine for a very bitter flavor.

Serve with standard dog accessories; potato, bean or macaroni salad or some of each, potato chips and ice cold drinks .

The Red Dog will wipe the memory of those sissy mustard, ketchup and relish garnishes completely out of your mind!

Bourbon - Kentucky's Own Terri Charles

There are two things for which the state of Kentucky is most famous: Horse racing, and Bourbon whiskey.

Today, let's talk about the namesake of Kentucky's special blend of whiskey which is known as "bourbon." Almost everyone (both imbibers and non-imbibers) has heard of bourbon whiskey; however, not as many are aware that there is a county in Kentucky called Bourbon County. Once one becomes familiar with this fact, a question that may arise to the inquisitive mind would be: Which came first - the whiskey or the county? And, the next logical question might be: "Where did the name "bourbon" come from?

To find the answer to these curious questions, we need to go back in time a bit...and then a little bit further. All the way back to the 16th century when France began sending men over to the North American continent to stake its claims on the new land. After much exploration and endurance, France claimed a good deal of land. However, Britain was also vying to claim the new lands, which eventually caused a war between the French colonists and the British colonists The English labeled this conflict the French and Indian War. At the end of the war (1763), France had lost much of its land interests in North America to Britain.

A little over a decade later, the American colonists wanted to gain their independence from Britain. The colonists, needing support, sent representatives to France to request aid. The French, still angry at their enemy, Britain, for taking their colonies in America were all too eager to assist the American colonists in their struggle for independence.

The name of the King of France which assisted the colonists in their revolution was Louis the XVI, who was from the "Royal House of Bourbon." It is said that without the assistance provided from the French king, the colonists would not have won the Revolutionary War. "Bourbon County," Kentucky was named in 1785 in homage to King Louis the XVI of the House of Bourbon.

The area of Bourbon County, Kentucky, is mostly farmland where corn and other grains are grown. Of course, it was rather profitable for the farmers to turn much of their crops into whiskey to sell.

Many farmers in other states mostly used rye, wheat, and barley for making their whiskey, but farmers from Bourbon County, Kentucky, used a higher percentage of corn in their whiskey. Corn is a sweet grain which causes whiskey to taste sweeter.

Also, these farmers would ship their whiskey in barrels stamped **"Bourbon County"** down the Mississippi to more southern states. The whiskey would age in the barrels as it leisurely floated down the Mississippi. Thus, the combination of sweeter ingredients and mellowing with age gave Bourbon County whiskey a distinctive flavor. The term "bourbon" was applied in the 1800's to differentiate Bourbon County whiskey from that shipped from other areas.
