Safe Hiking in Cliffview and State and Federal Forests of the Red River Gorge Geological Area

The hiking season is now in full swing. Hundreds, thousands of folks from all over the country regularly

visit Cliffview Resort and the Red River Gorge Area to enjoy nature's bounty. There is no better way to experience all the area has to offer than to hike the hundreds of trails in federal, state and private land. We want everyone to have the best hiking experience possible and leave the area with fond memories and beautiful pictures and videos.

To make the experience fun, informative and safe we offer a few hints and some do's and don'ts.

* First and foremost, the Boy Scouts are right, <u>Be Prepared!\</u>

- * The Mountains are known for unpredictable weather. Check the weather forecast for the area.
- * Plan your hike--know about the area and how to get there. Get detailed maps.
- * Take enough food, clothing, and equipment to keep you comfortable for at least another day and night longer than planned in case of emergency.
- * Notify others of where you will be, and when you plan to be home, in case someone needs to contact you. Let them know when you return.
- * If you are a beginner, contact local outfitters or camping and hiking locations for a general check list of needed equipment. It's a very good idea to have a comprehensive Red Cross approved First Aid kit and manual.

- * Take a cell phone with a fully charged battery. Make certain there is service in the area you plan to explore
- * Download a GPS app so friends and family can track your progress and always know exactly where you are. In areas with no service, inexpensive walkie-talkies are a reasonable alternative.
- * Always bring waterproof matches or a couple of Bic lighters and a knife of some kind.
- * A loud whistle is another good idea. It can be used to attract attention if 'confused' and may convince an unwelcome animal to leave the area.
- * If hiking in an area bears are known to habituate, make some noise while hiking. Sing, clap your hands, talk, whatever. Bears don't like to be surprised and if they know you're approaching, they'll usually go the other way.
- * Remember, you're a guest, be courteous and appreciative.

If you carry it in, please carry it out!

- * Take only pictures; leave only footprints and leave those only on <u>designated trails and areas</u>. Remember, when you're enjoying any federal area, guidelines forbid the taking of even a pebble from national parks.
- * Never, ever cut a live tree for firewood or any other reason.
- * Be respectful of your state and national forests; keep the trees and shrubs alive and growing.
- * If hiking with Fido, keep him on a leash no longer than 6 feet.

Green Driving (Like the Color of Money)

How You Could Save a Cool Thousand Bucks

You could save enough to virtually get a free ride back to the Red River Gorge next year!!

With the price of gasoline once again approaching \$5.00+ per gallon and expected to continue to rise, we are all suffering "pump shock". We know from past experience that gas prices can rise faster than politicians can lie yet fall at a pace slower than the line at the license bureau. What can be done to save money when gasoline is so vital to our life-styles? There are things we can do to save gas, money and help the environment too. It's easy and will take up very little time. It requires no sacrifice and we won't have to change our daily routines. To o good to be true, you say? Not at all. Here's how - by increasing a car's gas mileage (mpg). You don't have to be a mechanic either. You won't even get your hands dirty. All you need is common sense and information. You provide the common sense, we'll provide some information.

Increasing mpg will increase your miles per dollar (mpd), the immediate benefit of fuel efficiency. The Earth and all its inhabitants will benefit too. Use less fuel and you contribute less to pollution. With little effort, the average driver can save \$50 to \$200+ per year in fuel costs.

For instance: if you are an average driver, driving 15,000 miles per year, and your car is getting 20 mpg, you use 750 gallons of gasoline per year. At \$5.00 per gallon, that's over \$3,000. Increase your mileage by only one mpg and you'll save \$180! Increase the mpg by 5 mpg and you're saving \$750.

The savings are substantial especially if your car is a "gas guzzler". A car getting 15 at \$5 mpg burns \$5,000 in gas per year. At 16 mpg that same car would save the driver about \$314. A 5 mpg increase would save *almost \$2,00 per year*! Getting that extra mpg is easy and sometimes free. Here are some tips for increasing gas mileage:

* Use quality gasoline of the grade recommended for your car. Poor grades of gas may not have the proper detergent additives to keep injectors clean and therefore more efficient.

- * When filling up, always stop pumping when you hear the nozzle click off. Sure, you may get another half-pint in there. You also may spill a half-pint onto the lot.
- Do that every time you fill up for a year and you throw seven or eight bucks worth of gas on the ground. You will have also forced a substantial amount of gas fumes out into the air that would otherwise stay within the fuel system.
- * Keep tires inflated to the recommended pressure. If your tires are under-inflated, you are wasting gas. Low tires create drag. Check tire pressure before a long trip and about every 2-3 weeks.
- * Since all cars are now equipped with fuel injection, there's no need to wait for it to warm up after starting. But do wait a few seconds, long enough for the oil to get circulating.
- * When accelerating, remember that a smooth, easy rate saves gas. Once you get up to your cruising speed, try to stay at that speed. Slowing down, then speeding up wastes gas and annoys those driving behind you.
- * Try to anticipate stops and take your foot off the accelerator early. Coast into the stop. Apply the brakes smoothly and you'll save gas plus cut down on wear and tear on your brakes. If possible, drive as if you had no brakes. Gas mileage will shoot up! The problem with that system is that it doesn't work if you have people driving behind you. It will do no good to try to explain you're saving fuel for their sake as well!
- * If you'll be stopped for more than a couple of minutes, shut your car off. Restarting the car will use less gas than letting it idle for that long.
- * An engine uses less gas once it's warmed up, so combining several errand trips into one will save gas as well as time.
- * If your car needs it, a tune-up is the one thing that will increase mpg the most. A tune-up will cost from \$75 to over \$400, but a tune-up may *double* the mpg of a car.
- * An oil change won't give a noticeable increase in mpg, but it will help your engine work less

and thereby use less fuel. And increase the life of your car's engine.

One last thing - the most effective way to increase mpd is to walk or ride a bicycle for short errands. That bit of exercise may also give you more time to enjoy all that extra cash you're saving.

It Happened In July

July events in Kentucky's history Used with permission from Robert A. Powell, author of It Happened Today! In Kentucky History

July 14, 1776 – Jemimah Boone, 13 years old along with two friends, Elizabeth and Frances Calloway, were captured by a raiding band of Cherokee and Shawnee near Boonesborough. Two days later, Jemimah's father, Daniel Boone, and seven other men rescued them.

July 2, 1982 - The one millionth Corvette rolled off the assembly line at the Corvette Assembly Plant in Bowling Green, one year after the plant was moved from St Louis. Since then as many as 170+ are built daily. More than 100,000 Corvettes have been built there. The plant is the only one that produces the Corvette and the Cadillac CTS V8 engines. People who order a Corvette can visit the plant and watch their car being built.
